It is your responsibility to meet the necessary requirements. The required qualifications for team staff are available on the Ringette Alberta website at www.ringettealberta.com. All team staff MUST complete their certification requirements by DECEMBER 15th of the current playing season to be eligible for any sanctioned tournament scheduled after December 15th or Ringette Alberta Provincial Championships.

If you are unsure of your coaching qualifications, please go to www.coach.ca enter your cc# and you will be able to view your coach transcript to date. If you do not know your cc#, please email the Coaching Association of Canada at coach@coach.ca. You will need to provide your name and mailing address.

Ringette Calgary requires all team staff to follow the Ringette Alberta standards of certification. Team staff deadline for meeting certification requirements is December 15th, 2009.

Coaching Workshops:

Three sessions will be held during the 2009 – 2010 season focusing with the goal of providing coaches with information, resources and practical experience to improve their ability to design and deliver more effective practices.

These sessions will include:

1. Bunny and Novice Player Development – October 18 – Centennial Arena Meeting Room
2. Petite and Tween Player Development – November 15 – Centennial Arena Meeting Room
3. Goalie Development (TBA)

The sessions will run from 7:00 – 9:00pm and are free.

Managers:

To be eligible to be on the bench during any sanctioned events after December 15th, 2009, City Playoffs and Provincial Championships, Managers must have successfully completed a Manager's Certification Program. After reading the manual, the Manager must complete a test that is included in the manual and submit it to Ringette Canada for evaluation. Manuals are available at the Ringette Calgary office.
